Staying Alert (new role)	Keep a lookout and report suspicious items and behaviour (including early reporting of people displaying signs of radicalisation)	Vigilance and early reporting will allow authorities to intervene in a timely manner. In particular with the rise of more self-radicalised cases in Singapore, early intervention will allow authorities to prevent such persons from harming themselves and others.	The "Report" feature of the SGSecure app allows members of the public to submit reports and photos of suspicious items or behaviours.
Staying United (new role)	Obtain and share news from official or credible sources of information, and not to spread rumours or unverified information in the event of a security or terrorist incident	In the event of a terrorist attack, security incident, or even a foiled attack, our collective response as a nation is critical. Rumours and misinformation can trigger more fear and panic, and erode trust in the community. By referring to and sharing news from only official or credible	The "Alert" feature of the SGSecure app, allows users to receive information on overseas and local security and public order related incidents.

Staying Strong (existing role)	Learn lifesaving skills and take part in public spiritedness acts, including responding to cardiac arrest and minor fire cases in their vicinity	 During emergencies, timely response by those onsite or nearby before the arrival of emergency services can save lives. By learning lifesaving skills, Responders will also be better prepared to deal with an emergency. By joining as an SGSecure Responder, it will contribute to growing the common pool of Responders in our community, together with SCDF's Community First Responder initiative. 	The "Respond" feature in the SGSecure app, will notify SGSecure responders of cardiac arrest and minor fire cases near them, which they can respond to provide assistance prior to arrival of emergency services.
