## Amendments to Misuse of Drugs Act

The Misuse of Drugs (Amendment) Bill will

A. Introduce a new legislative framework for psychoactive substances.

B. Increase the punishment for possession of larger quantities of more dangerous and harmful controlled drugs.







## A. New Legislative Framework for Psychoactive Substances

New Psychoactive Substances (NPS) mimic the effects of controlled drugs such as cannabis and heroin.

Examples of NPS include synthetic cannabinoids and synthetic cathinones.





## A. New Legislative Framework for Psychoactive Substances

To strengthen deterrence against psychoactive substances, the amendments will:



Introduce a new framework to control substances based on their capacity to produce a psychoactive effect, instead of their chemical structure, unless excluded in a specified Schedule.



Criminalise the trafficking, manufacturing, importing, exporting, possession and consumption of psychoactive substances, and allow for the arrest and detention of abusers for treatment and rehabilitation.



## B. Increased punishment for possession of larger quantities of controlled drugs deemed to be more dangerous and harmful

The current sentencing framework for drug possession does not sufficiently account for the potential harm that could be caused by persons with large amounts of controlled drugs in their possession.



A more deterrent punishment is necessary to deter the proliferation of drugs locally.

Increased punishments, including caning, will be introduced for the possession of selected controlled drugs above certain weight thresholds.
