A public perception survey conducted in 2018 found that there is very strong support for Singapore's tough stance against drugs and existing punishments against drug trafficking.

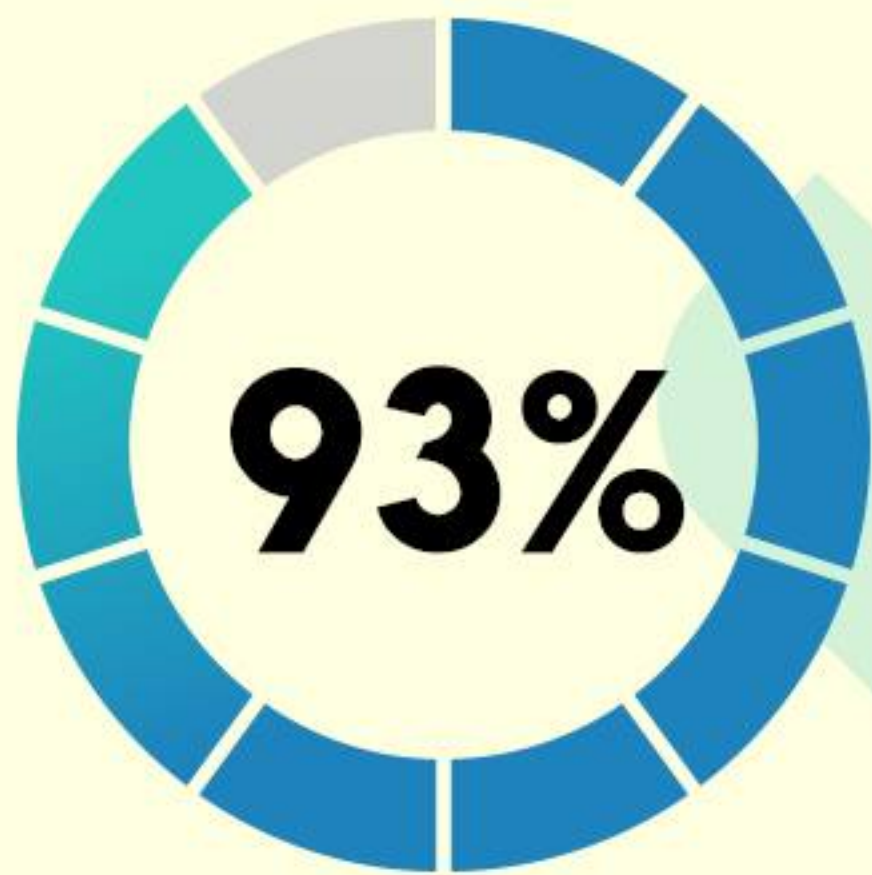
STRONG SUPPORT FOR SINGAPORE'S TOUGH STANCE AGAINST DRUGS

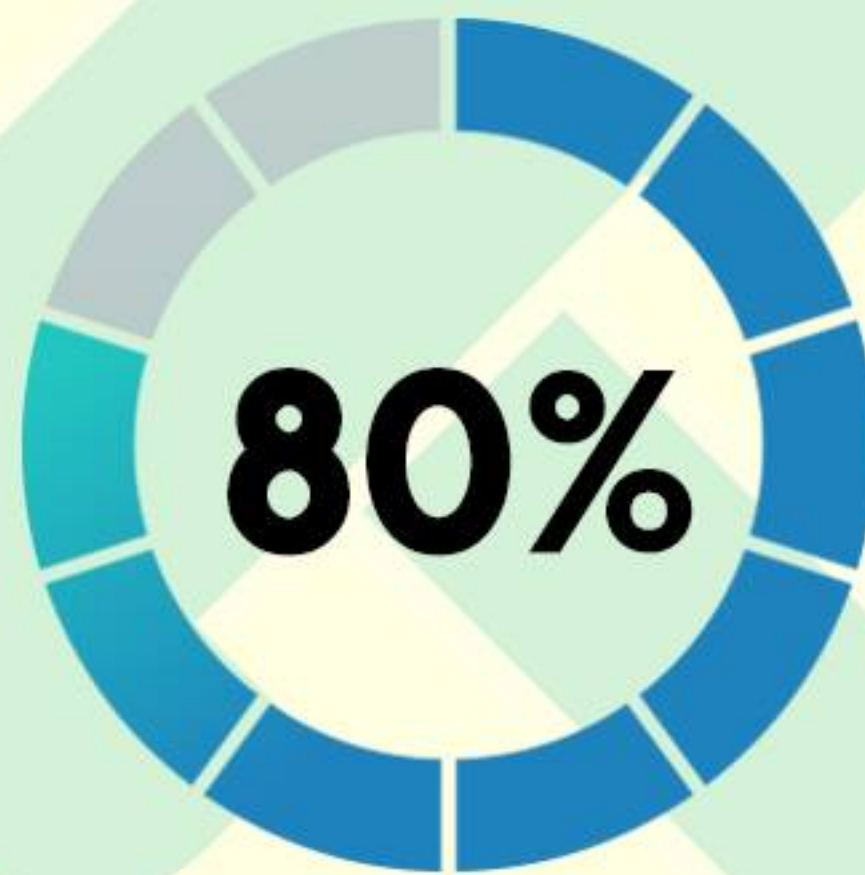

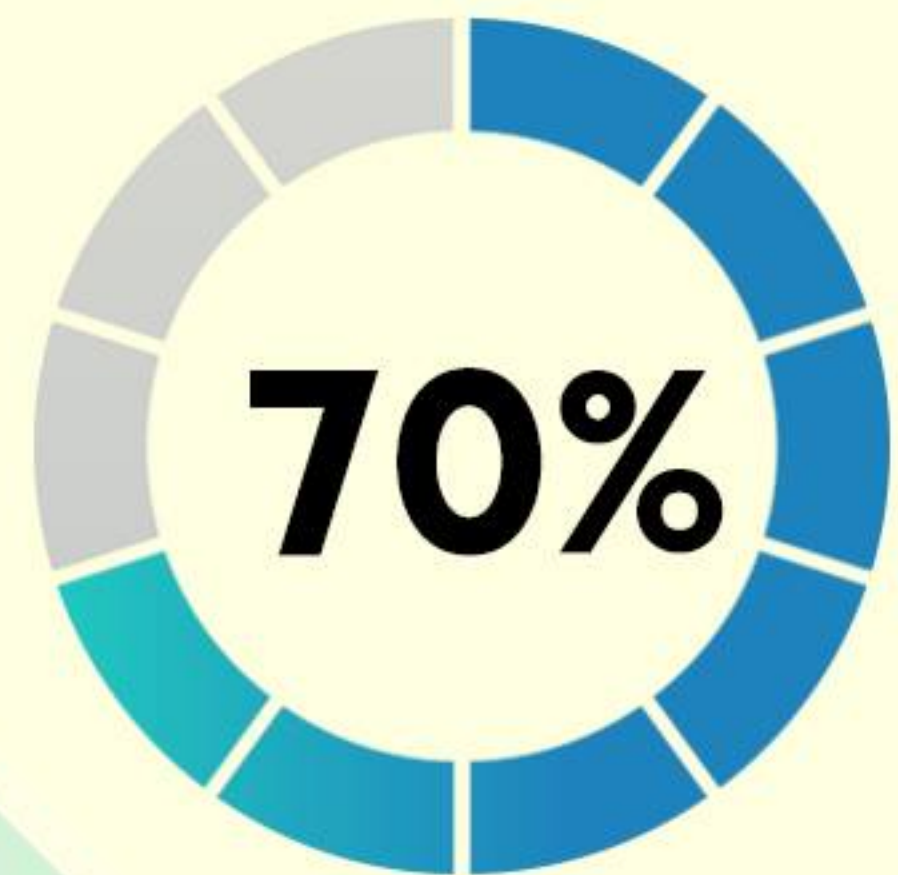
