Continuous Learning with the Home Team

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed on 11 December between MHA and the Singapore University of Social Sciences (SUSS) for further collaborations in training and learning.

MHA and SUSS have been working together over the past three years, with SUSS providing technical assistance to help build up MHA's training and learning capabilities. Under the MoU, MHA and SUSS will jointly develop programmes and projects that contribute to continuing education and training for Home Team officers.

CARE NETWORK - ISCOS

Give a Line, Change a Life

ISCOS (industry & Services Co-Operative Society) launched a new mobile app at Selarang Halfway House on 9 December. The ISCOS mobile app provides ex-offenders with updates on ISCOS services and programmes, such as pro-social support and job placement schemes. Users can also use the app to sign up for events, submit enquiries and make appointments with ISCOS staff.

ISCOS has also launched **Give a Line, Change a Life,** a project that increases the accessibility of the mobile app to ex-offenders who may not have the means to afford smartphones or mobile data plans upon their release. ISCOS partnered with corporate sponsors to provide free smartphones and Zero1 Unlimited Data Mobile Plans, pre-installed with the ISCOS mobile app.

PCG SPECIAL TASK SQUADRON (STS) GRADUATION CEREMONY

Fearless Maritime Guardians

On 26 November, the 21st batch of PCG's STS graduated in a ceremony held at PCG's Brani Base. For their graduation exercise, the graduates comprising officers from STS and Gurkha Special Action Group conducted a joint-ops exercise. Beginning with a forced entry of the ship, the officers neutralised assailants and secured the vessel by executing Contact Tactics, Ballistic Breaching and Room Entry before a final assault at the Live Firing Area.

Having completed their mission, the officers proceeded with their graduation ceremony, officially taking their place among fellow STS professionals who are dedicated to countering complex maritime security threats. Well done, Guardians!

FIREFIGHTERS TO THE RESCUE



A total of 34 emergency vehicles and about 130 firefighters were deployed to contain the football pitch-sized blaze, with ten jets and three Unmanned Firefighting Machines used to mitigate the fire at its peak. The fire was brought under control by approximately 10AM, with no reported injuries.

FYI In an emergency, a rapid response is key. SCDF first responders arrived at the incident site within four minutes of the fire call. Due to the size of the blaze, it took four hours before the flames were contained and firefighters could enter the site to conduct damping-down operations.
