16TH RELIGIOUS REHABILITATION GROUP SEMINAR

SAFEGUARDING OUR RACIAL AND RELIGIOUS HARMONY

At the 16th Religious Rehabilitation Group (RRG) Seminar on 24 November, MIN K Shanmugam affirmed RRG's vital role as a voice for religious tolerance and in standing firm against violence and terrorism. Noting the recent terror attacks in France and beyond, MIN Shanmugam discussed the current security landscape and reiterated Singapore's approach to safeguarding racial and religious harmony.

1. Singapore's Approach: The Right to Speak Freely Goes with the Duty to Act Responsibly

While the Governments of Singapore and France are both secular and guarantee freedom of religion, we take a different approach to safeguard racial and religious harmony.

"Because we take the position that the right to speak freely goes with the duty to act responsibly, the two must go together. And, as a secular Government, we are neutral in the treatment of all religions... We guarantee freedom of religion, the right of every person to practice his or her religious beliefs, and we protect everyone, majority or



2. In Response to Recent Attacks in France, the Home Team is on Heightened Alert

Security in Singapore has been ramped up to prevent copycat attacks. SPF has increased its ground presence while ISD has stepped up its monitoring efforts. As a result, several individuals have been caught for suspected radicalisation and involvement in terrorism.

3. It Takes a Whole-of-Society Effort to Keep Singapore Safe from Terrorism

FACIAL, IRIS SCANS AS THE PRIMARY BIOMETRIC IDENTIFIER AT ALL CHECKPOINTS













Since July, our land, sea and air immigration checkpoints have been equipped with iris and facial scanners, providing a more secure and efficient means of traveller identity authentication. The **Multi-Modal Biometric System (MMBS)**, which enables the use of iris, facial and fingerprint biometrics for immigration clearance, was developed to centralise all biometric services and data to support ICA's biometric needs.

As one of the critical enablers in ICA's New Clearance Concept, MMBS allows a seamless and efficient immigration clearance experience via automated clearance facilities. To achieve the vision of residents clearing Singapore immigration without presenting their passports by 2022, HTX will look into furthering biometric development on two fronts.

HTX will improve existing mainstream biometrics use with on-the-move iris capture, contactless fingerprints scans and detection of which finger has been presented during scans for more accurate matching.

HTX is also exploring the potential of using other biometric features to be used in ICA's future operations.

KEY FEATURES OF MMBS

- Less issues with fingerprint verification (such as deterioration of fingerprints due to ageing, scarring and dryness).
- More reliable identification since iris patterns have a higher degree of variation and uniqueness (with iris scans providing almost 250 feature points for matching, compared to fingerprint scans with 100 feature points).
- Less susceptible to misuse with specialised equipment needed to conduct iris scans.
- More hygienic, convenient and efficient, with simultaneous touch-free capture of two biometrics.


