COMMITTEE OF SUPPLY (COS) DEBATE 2020

At the COS Debate in Parliament, Minister K Shanmugam, Second Minister Josephine Teo, Senior Parliamentary Secretary Amrin Amin and Senior Parliamentary Secretary Sun Xueling outlined key initiatives undertaken by the Home Team and how our Home Team Guardians are working to keep Singapore safe and secure.

A Strong Home Team for a Safe and Secure Home



Strengthened protection for vulnerable groups

- Amended Penal Code and Protection from Harassment Act (POHA)



Strengthened ability to deal with religion-based conflict

- Amended the Maintenance of Religious Harmony Act for effective action against threats to religious harmony
- Framework enhanced religious freedom within Singapore



Maintained Singapore's approach to Public Order

- Singaporeans can protest at the Speakers' Corner at Hong Lim Park, without the need for a permit
- Otherwise, under the Public Order Act, it is an offence to organise or participate in a public assembly without a Police permit



An effective Home Team to maintain law and order

- Rise to the challenge to manage national crises - officers deployed to manage COVID-19
- Invest in our officers and raise the retirement age of officers on the Home Affairs Uniformed (HUS) Scheme from 55 to 58 by 2030, to tap on their experience
- Enhance Police Coast Guard capabilities to better handle coastal water incidents

Transforming the Home Team to Safeguard Singapore

The Home Team Science and Technology Agency (HTX) will house 14 Centres of Expertise to develop deep tech capabilities to support Home Team operations



- Leverage robotics, automation and unmanned systems to optimise scarce manpower, increase operational capacity and agility



- Sharpen capabilities to defend against Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosives (CBRNE) threats



- Develop new digital forensic capabilities to support investigations



Harness technology to deliver better services

- ICA has been digitalising its services to provide more hassle-free and efficient immigration clearance



Develop talent to enhance operational readiness to deal with future threats and challenges

- Grow HTX's talent pool of engineers and scientists
- Introduce an "Ops-Tech Career Track" for uniformed officers

Combating Drug Abuse and Strengthening Rehabilitation Together



Enhancing Singapore's approach to combat growing trends of concern

- Review laws to stay ahead of drug trends and deal with threat of New Psychoactive Substances (NPS), the third most commonly abused drug
- Sharpen Preventive Drug Education to correct misinformation about drugs and address changing attitudes towards Cannabis
- Co-create and co-deliver the anti-drug message with youths, to youths
- Collaborate with communities and groups on anti-drug engagement



Strengthening rehabilitation and re-integration of offenders

- Continue to work with community partners and agencies to support inmates and their families
- Expand network of volunteers to support ex-offenders in staying crime-free
- Empower inmates to take charge of their rehabilitation and learning
- Enhance employment opportunities for inmates by equipping them with industry-relevant skills. SCORE will partner Singapore Precision Engineering and Technology Association and MediaCorp to set up training academies

Strengthening measures to tackle tech-enabled crimes

- Ensure enforcement capabilities keep pace with technological developments
- Set up an Inter-Ministry Committee to coordinate approach and efforts to combat scams



Continue building the SGSecure movement to increase community preparedness and resilience against terrorism

- Roll out customised programmes so that individuals know what to do in the event of an attack



Continue partnering the community to save lives

- Under the Save-A-Life (SAL) initiative, more than 5,200 AEDs were installed and more than half a million people have been trained in CPR-AED skills
- Tiered Response Framework prioritised life-threatening emergencies to receive Emergency Medical Services
- Increase public awareness on when "995" should be called

LAUNCH OF INTER-AGENCY TASK FORCE



Saying No to Family Violence

The educational picture book **'A Day with Bob'** was launched by SPS Sun Xueling MHA & MND, together with SPS Muhammad Faishal Ibrahim MSF, on 17 February. A collaboration between Ang Mo Kio Police Division and PAVE, a voluntary welfare organisation that specialises in the management of interpersonal violence, the book carries a very important message for children – not to be ashamed if they are victims of family violence, and to seek help. SPF and PAVE will be working with MOE to distribute 25,000 copies of 'A Day with Bob' to primary schools.

Expansion of Home Team CARES

At the launch event, SPS Sun also announced the launch of a new inter-agency task force to offer greater support to victims of family violence. The task force will be co-chaired by SPS Sun and SPS Faishal. Among the initiatives that will be rolled out is an expansion of the scope of **Home Team CARES (Community Assistance and Referral Scheme)**. First piloted at Bedok Police Division in January 2019, Home Team CARES will be expanded for social workers to provide support to next-of-kin of offenders in family violence cases.

DUTY AND DEDICATION ON THE FRONTLINERS

Since the emergence of COVID-19 (Coronavirus Disease 2019) in Singapore, the Home Team has moved swiftly to support the national response to this threat and ensure that comprehensive measures are in place to safeguard public safety, while ensuring the health of our officers.

Here's a snapshot of how our Home Team Guardians are playing their part:



As the COVID-19 situation continues to develop, our Home Team Guardians are committed to safeguarding the safety and security of Singapore. On 14 February, PM Lee Hsien Loong visited Changi Airport Terminal 3 to meet ICA officers and medical personnel. PM Lee encouraged the officers and brought gifts for those hard at work during this critical period.

DPM Heng Swee Keat and SPS Sun Xueling also visited Kallang Fire Station on 16 February to learn more about SCDF's EMS operations and the enhanced measures that officers are taking in response to COVID-19. They spoke to emergency ambulance crew as well as SCDF officers supporting temperature screenings at Changi Airport. Athletes from Team Singapore joined the visit and cheered on our Guardians in blue with ice cream and gifts.

On 11 February, MIN K Shanmugam visited Home Team units to meet officers and convey his appreciation for their commitment and hard work. Besides meeting SPF officers who are responsible for the security of quarantine operations at CSC@Changi II, he also visited CID to learn more about how officers have been leveraging their investigative expertise to assist MOH with contact tracing.

MIN Shanmugam also visited another Government Quarantine Facility at the National Community Leadership Institute to meet SCDF medical personnel and officers who were conducting swabbing operations on Persons Under Quarantine. SCDF has introduced new protocols to screen emergency calls for possible COVID-19 cases. On 12 February, SPS Amrin visited SCDF HQ and Paya Lebar Fire Station, to learn more about this and to meet ambulance crews and other frontline personnel.



Anyone can be an SGSecure Responder, so long as you are willing to help others in distress.



To sign up as an SGSecure Responder:

- Download the SGSecure App
- Register via the "Respond" feature



After signing up, you will receive alerts to these cases happening near you:

- Cardiac arrest
- Minor fires

You are not obligated to respond. Do so only when you can, and only if it is safe. Prior certification in CPR is not required.




