## HOME TEAM UPDATES

#### MIN: DEATH PENALTY A SERIOUS DETERRENT

MIN K Shanmugam took on hard-hitting questions on BCC's HARDtalk on 29 June and reiterated Singapore's tough stance on drugs and the death penalty.



"Capital punishment is one aspect of a whole series of measures that we have... It's imposed on drug traffickers... because there's clear evidence that it is a serious deterrent for would-be drug traffickers."

He also spoke on racial discrimination, maintaining relations with China and the US, and the importance of governance in an increasingly anti-globalised world.

## SWIFTERS ON THE SEAS

To better safeguard our long coastline and stay ahead of challenges in a complex maritime environment, the Police Coast Guard has upgraded its fleet with next-generation patrol craft. **Minister K Shanmugam commissioned the three new types of boats** in a ceremony on 30 June.

The new fleet is designed for improved speed and is better equipped to detect and neutralise threats. This is critical as our small sea space gives very little reaction time to tackle incoming threats before they reach our shores, said MIN Shanmugam.

#### **POLICE DAY PARADE**

To commemorate Police Day which falls on 3 June, SPF held a physical parade last Friday – its first since the pandemic. President Halimah Yacob inspected the parade as the Guest-of-Honour and presented awards for the Best Land Division and the Best National Service (NS) Operationally Ready Unit. MOS Desmond Tan presented awards to the best Full-time Police National Service (PNSF) officers and Police National Servicemen (PNSmen). Over 2,000 officers attended the parade wearing the Singapore Police Bicentennial Medal for the first time.

## TRANSFORMING CORRECTIONS UPLIFTING LIVES

After achieving a record 30-year low in the two-year recidivism rate at 20%, SPS and YRSG are setting their sights on a more ambitious target: lowering the five-year recidivism rate, MOS Faishal announced at the SPS-YRSG Corporate Advance held on 17 June.



MOS highlighted new initiatives to achieve the goal, including:

- Strengthening Family Support for Inmates with Young Children Referrals to Family Service Centres, if family assistance is required, for all inmates with young children by 2023.
- Implementing Employment Preparation Scheme Letting suitable inmates undergo skills training and education in the community.
- Establishing a Desistor Network To provide peer support for ex-offenders as part of the Community Mobilisation plan.
- Launch of "Friends of YRSG" Telegram Channel (t.me/friendsofyrsg) To strengthen the community of advocates offering second chances.

## THE FUTURE IS HERE



Themed 'The Future is Here', this year's SCDF Workplan Seminar held on 10 June focused on new innovation and technology to meet its goal of fostering "A Nation of Lifesavers".



Guest-of-Honour MOS Faishal announced the upcoming deployment of HazMat sensors across the island and the EMS non-dispatch policy for cases deemed non-emergency by the 995 Operations Centre.

MOS also launched the Emergency Responders' Fitness Conditioning & Enhancement Laboratory (EXCEL) developed jointly with HTX. The lab provides officers with individualised training through physiological and cognitive data analyses, such as:

- Strength, Conditioning & Rehabilitation in Virtual Environment (STRIVE) Lab: An immersive environment that assesses and analyses officers' movements to ensure optimal physical condition for training and operations.

- Heat Acclimatisation and Thermoregulation (HEAT) Lab: A chamber that simulates climatic conditions for conducting the Breathing Apparatus Proficiency Test (BAPT), heat related research and acclimatisation programmes.



MOS also unveiled the latest Red Rhino, which will include the second-generation Red Rhino Robot, a Fire Blanket to contain vehicle fires and two Compressed Air Foam trolleys.
