On 25th August, the Home Team Behavioural Sciences Centre (HTBSC) brought together various partners from the finance and e-commerce industries, academia, community groups and various Government agencies for its inaugural anti-crime seminar titled Scaminar! The Fight Against Scams.

In his opening address, MOS Desmond Tan highlighted that scams are not just a local problem, but a global one. In Singapore alone, scams have increased three-fold since 2016. In 2020, they accounted for 42% of all crime cases with losses estimated to be about \$265 million. While significant progress has been made in tackling scams – through the setting-up of SPF’s Anti-Scam Division and partnerships with industry partners – MOS Desmond reiterated that a whole-of-society approach is needed to effectively combat online crime, which has been evolving quickly with digital technology.

- Strengthen SPF's disciplinary, administrative and human resources processes.
- Strengthen controls over Auxiliary Police Forces.

REGIONAL PARTNERSHIP IN DISASTER MANAGEMENT



“COVID-19 restrictions and measures have slowed down disaster response and the deployment of aid to the affected communities. How do we ensure that our disaster management response is future-ready, and is able to deal with emerging challenges? This is a critical question.

I would like to suggest three areas that we can focus on. First, strengthen the local responses. Second, explore new ways of raising funds for disaster management. Third, leverage technology to improve efficiency and effectiveness of disaster response operations.”

The ASEAN Strategic Policy Dialogue on Disaster Management (SPDDM) 2021 took place virtually from 24 to 26 August. A key platform to promote thought leadership and chart directions for the ASEAN Committee on Disaster Management, SPDDM is co-organised by SCDF, the ASEAN Secretariat and the ASEAN Coordinating Centre for Humanitarian Assistance on disaster management, with the support of the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation.

SPDDM 2021 brought together some 470 local and international participants, comprising representatives of National Disaster Management Organisations from ASEAN and other regions, Ambassadors, and dialogue and industry partners, as well as representatives from international organisations, the private sector and NGOs.

AED-ON-WHEELS



To increase the chances of availing Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) to those suffering from cardiac arrests, MOS Muhammad Faishal Ibrahim launched the SCDF-ComfortDelGro AED-on-Wheels programme on 26 August 2021.



This is SCDF's fourth such community initiative, which sees 50 ComfortDelGro taxis and 10 ComfortDelGro MedCare minibuses equipped with AEDs, and 60 drivers trained as Community First Responders to render CPR and first aid. These drivers will be alerted through SCDF's myResponder app to cardiac arrest cases occurring within 1.5km of their vehicles' locations.

SGSECURE: COMMON SENSES FOR COMMON SPACES DIALOGUE



The Government, individuals and community partners need to collectively build a more cohesive, united and resilient Singapore, and this requires constant effort – said MOS Desmond Tan on 8th August at the Common Senses for Common Spaces Interfaith Dialogue – Holy Smoke, organised by the NGO Humanity Matters.

Addressing the participants – youths, academics and religious and community leaders – MOS Desmond encouraged them to translate dialogue into action by participating in community activities that foster stronger racial harmony, and not to, “counter racism with more racism, or extremism with more extremism, because this will only lead to a greater divide among our people and communities.”

HONOURING OUR POLICE OFFICERS

A Private Member's Motion was filed in Parliament this week by Mr Christopher De Souza to commemorate SPF200.

Responding to the Motion, MIN K Shanmugam thanked SPF for its contributions and shared that a commemorative Singapore Police Bicentennial 2020 Medal will be awarded to SPF officers who were in service for any period between 1 January 2020 and 31 December 2020. A Medallion will also be awarded to former Police officers, Civilian officers who were in service with SPF in 2020 and the families of SPF officers who had given their lives in the line of duty.

ENGAGING THE WHOLE OF SOCIETY TO COMBAT TERRORISM

Launched in September 2016 by PM Lee Hsien Loong, the SGSecure national movement has played a major role over the years in raising awareness about the threat of terrorism among the public and building up the resilience of our community. SGSecure’s best practices and successes are now being introduced to the international community – in June, the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation’s Centre of Excellence for Defence Against Terrorism published its Good Practices in Counter Terrorism handbook, which includes a chapter on various initiatives by SGSecure.

Author Susan Sim explains how SGSecure has taken a whole-of-society approach to train, mobilise and work with a range of community groups. These groups in turn share key SGSecure messages with their stakeholders and help to counter extremist ideologies without stigmatising any particular religion or race.

The community plays a vital role in rejecting terrorist activities and extremist ideologies, and strengthening social cohesion. Together, we make SGSecure!
